Dennis McNulty graduated from Greenwood High School in 1972, received his BA in 1977 from Indiana Central, and his MA from Indiana University of 1982. Mac ran in 3 NCAA College Division Cross Country National Championships and was the top Indiana finisher at the Boston Marathon in 1975 with a time of 2:37:02. He began coaching at Clarksville High School in 1977, went to Noblesville High School in 1981, then on to Maconaquah High School in 1985, and has been at Warren Central since 1987.

In his 32nd year of coaching, Dennis has been nominated for IATCCC's Track Coach of the Year 10 times and was the IATCCC Track Coach of the Year 4 times. He was also the National High School Federation National Coach of the Year in 2007. He has been named a semi finalist for the National H.S. Coaches Association National Coach of the year for 2007. Dennis started the first Hoosier State Games (White River Park Games) in 1982 and has been a USATF Master Official, being certified in all events at all levels. He was past President of

Indiana USATF (Indiana TAC) in 1987 and was Region VI Coordinator for USATF (Indiana TAC) from 1986 – 1988. Mac was a track and field Official for the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games and on the stadium announcing staff during Atlanta's 1996 Olympic Games. In 1997, he was a member of the coaching staff for an International Sports Exchange Trip to China. He has been the track and field stadium announcer for the Big East Conference since 1999, announced the NCAA Cross Country Finals 5 times, and has announced the IAAF Grand Prix meet in Toronto, Canada that featured Olympic Champion Usain Bolt of Jamaica. Dennis is also the author of the acclaimed publication, *Indiana's Best*; an annual review of Indiana high school track and cross country. He has also served as president of the State Track Coaches Association.

In boys' track, McNulty coached IHSAA State Team Champions in 1995, 1996, 2006, and 2007. His team was the IHSAA Runner-up in 2005 and in 2009. He has coached 9 Sectional and 9 Regional championship teams. He coached teams to 10 IHSAA Top 10 State Meet finishes. Additionally, Dennis has coached 7 Individual IHSAA State Track Champions and 11 Individual IHSAA State Runner-ups. He coached 5 IHSAA Relay State Champions and 2 IHSAA Relay State Runners-up. In all, he has coached 174 IHSAA All State track and field medal winners and 24 Indiana All-Stars who competed in the Midwest Meet of Champions. He was the 2007 Indiana All Star Team's Head Coach in 2007. He has coached 14 High School All Americans. He also serves as an assistant coach for the two-time IHSAA State Champion boys cross country team.
