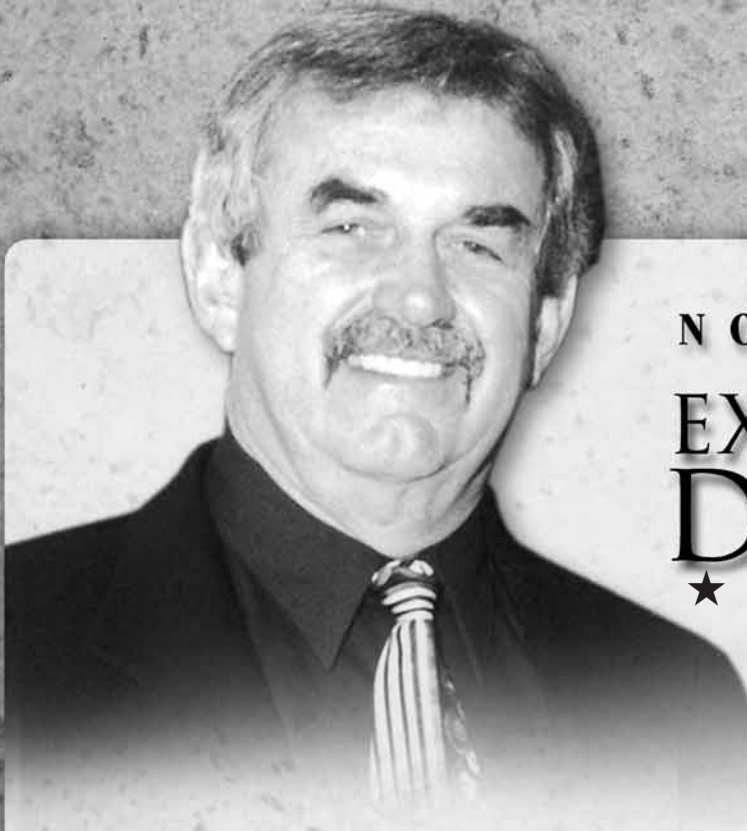

DR. FRANK C. McCUE, III SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Virginia High School Coaches Association

The Dr. Frank C. McCue, III Scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Frank McCue, III, an orthopedic surgeon and team physician at the University of Virginia. He is nationally known as an innovator in the field of sports medicine. He was a pioneer in this field and has treated athletes from "benchers to Hall of Famers" with equal professionalism and kind care.

Dr. McCue has treated and cared for athletes and coaches in Virginia for the past 40 years.

The VHSCA will award two scholarships annually in the amount of \$1,000 to two graduates of a Virginia accredited high school(s).

The first scholarship will be awarded to a student that will enter into the field of sports medicine, athletic training, or sports physical therapy.

The second scholarship will be awarded to a student that wishes to go into one of the above careers or into the field of coaching.

These will be awarded to a student who meets these criteria:

Applicants for either scholarship must not be receiving an athletic grant of more than one half the cost.

Each applicant must complete the application below, and the following:

(1) Submit an essay on how sports have influenced his or her life and his or her desire to pursue the fields of sports medicine or coaching as a career.

(2) Submit letters of recommendation from his or her high school coach and from his or her guidance counselor.

(3) Submit a copy of his or her high school transcript.

(4) Applicants are required to have been a member of a sports team as a player, a trainer's assistant, or manager.

All applicants will be notified after the scholarship recipients are selected. The \$1,000 will be credited to the account of the winners at the university or college he or she will be attending.

JIMMIE BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Virginia High School Coaches Association

This grant is named for Jimmie Bryan, who has provided outstanding leadership to our Association.

The intent of the Scholarship is to provide \$1,000 for two young athletes who are graduating from a Virginia High School League member school and who intend to teach and coach in Virginia. The recipients must not receive any financial assistance through his athletic participation in college.

Candidates must earn a minimum of six Varsity Athletic Letter awards in high school and the Scholarship will be competitive based on the Grade Point Average of the applicants. If three or more candidates meet all the qualifications and have the same Grade Point Average, then the tied applicants must submit a 500 word essay entitled "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School." This essay will be evaluated by the Scholarship Committee of the VHSCA and the winner will be selected. The \$1,000 will be credited to the account of the recipients at the Virginia College or University of his choice.

To be eligible for the scholarship, one must:

- A. Be a graduate of a **Virginia High School League** member school.
- B. Attend a college or university within the State of Virginia.
- C. Earn six (6) Varsity letters in athletics.
- D. Plan to teach and coach in a Virginia High School League member school. (No penalty if one does not).
- E. Not receive any financial assistance in college as a direct result of athletic participation.

The competitive aspects of the scholarship include:

- A. The three applicants with the highest final grade point average will be the winners. An official transcript must accompany the preliminary application and a final official transcript must be submitted as soon as possible.
- B. If three or more applicants have the same grade point average through seven (7) semesters; (9th Grade, 10th Grade, 11th Grade and 1st semester

12th Grade) the finalist must write a 500 word essay entitled, "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School."

This essay must be submitted on high school stationery and must be hand written. The scholarship committee of the Virginia High School Coaches' Association will make the final decision after reviewing the essays.

DEADLINES

May 1st—This application and an official transcript submitted.

June 1st—Finalists will be notified by Scholarship Committee.

June 15th—Finalists must submit 500 word essay "Why I Want to Coach in a Virginia High School League Member School." Verification of sixth Varsity letter award must be submitted.

July—Recipient will be announced and scholarship awarded at Virginia High School Coaches' Association Clinic.

Surrounding area attractions include **Colonial Williamsburg**, **Virginia Beach**, **Busch Gardens**, harbor tours on the largest natural harbor in the world, and water sports on the Chesapeake Bay. Our region is rich in colonial, Civil War, African American and aviation history!



The Virginia Air and Space Museum exhibits many of NASA's most dramatic space artifacts, including the Apollo 12 Command Module, a Viking Mars Lander, satellites, space suits, and moon rocks. The center also houses a dozen aircraft, the Hampton Roads History Center, and southeastern Virginia's only IMAX theater.



Hampton Attractions

AIR POWER PARK

Learn about Hampton's space and aviation history by touring the outdoor air and spacecraft displays, model airplane collection and wind tunnel exhibit at Air Power Park. Home to one of the largest civilian-owned collections of aircraft and missiles in the United States, Air Power Park contains aircraft from the country's various service branches, including a Nike surface-to-air missile, a P-1127 Kestrel vertical-lift jet and an F-100D Super Sabre, the first Air Force fighter with true supersonic performance.

BASS PRO SHOPS (OUTDOOR WORLD)

Located at Pine Chapel Road and I-64, Bass Pro Shops® Outdoor World® is much more than a hunting and fishing store, Bass Pro Shops also offers equipment for hiking, backpacking, camping, outdoor cooking and more. Shoppers will also find outdoor apparel for men, women and children, along with a fine selection of casual and athletic footwear. A gift and nature shop serves up a wide variety of outdoor-related items from lamps and dishes to bird feeders and furniture.

Unique exterior and interior motifs have branded Bass Pro Shops stores as Visually appealing, high quality outdoor stores. The outdoor feel is brought indoors through massive log and rock work, aquariums and water features, as well as an extensive collections of fish and wildlife exhibits all helping to maximize the experience of the outdoor enthusiast.

A large atrium inside showcases an impressive 30' rock mountain climbing wall, fashioned to resemble a rock bluff from the Roanoke Valley. A cascading waterfall tumbles down into a 19,000-gallon aquarium stocked with striped bass, catfish and crappie. The aquarium is also home to lunker largemouth bass. Trees plus other plants and wildlife native to Virginia can be seen on the rock ledges and crevices.

BEACHES AND FISHING

Buckroe Beach, located along Hampton's Chesapeake Bay shoreline, is a popular family beach. The beach officially opens Memorial Day weekend and closes Labor Day weekend. Lifeguards are on duty during the official season. Visitors are invited to enjoy the playground, in-water craft available for rent, guided beach explorer programs. Don't miss the evening entertainment on Tuesdays and Sundays during the summer season.

Grandview Nature Preserve and Beach, located off Beach Road, is ideal for wildlife observations, ecological studies and hiking. Grandview's 578 acres of marshland include a beach that stretches for more than two miles. Educational tours and guided canoe/kayak excursions through the preserve are offered.

Charter fishing boats depart from Down Hampton Public Piers, the foot of King Street, Salt Ponds Marina and Wallace's Marina at Dandy Point for excursions on the Chesapeake Bay. Several head boats offer fishing excursions and charters year-round.

HAMPTON HISTORY MUSEUM

Opened in May 2003, the Hampton History Museum interprets Hampton's unique past spanning from its inhabitation by the Kecoughtan Indians to the 20th century and the city's role as the birthplace of American space program. The center's ten galleries spotlight events in the city's history including the arrival of Captain John Smith and the first settlers, the demise of Blackbeard the Pirate, and the emergence of Hampton's seafood industry, establishing the city as "Crabtown." A changing gallery on the second floor hosts visiting historic and pop culture exhibits. The museum also houses the Hampton Visitor Center.

MISS HAMPTON II HARBOR CRUISES

A double-decked tour boat, the Miss Hampton II carries passengers out to the Hampton Roads harbor and Chesapeake Bay. On this narrated tour, visitors will cruise past Blackbeard's Point, Hampton University, Old Point Comfort and the Norfolk Naval Base, where they'll get a look at the mighty ships and submarines berthed at the world's largest naval base. A highlight of the cruise is a stop at Fort Wool, where passengers disembark for a guided tour of this island fortification.

VIRGINIA AIR & SPACE CENTER

The official visitor center for NASA Langley Research facilities, the Virginia Air & Space Center and Hampton Roads History Center houses a spectacular collection of flight- and space-related artifacts, interactive exhibits, historical displays and a giant-screen, 3-D IMAX® Theater. Visitors can see a three-billion-year-old moon rock, collected during the Apollo 17 mission; the Apollo 12 Command Module that journeyed to the moon and back; and a replica of the Lunar Orbiter, which mapped the moon's surface for future landings. The Cosmic Café offers food and be sure to browse the gift shop.

Unveiled in time to celebrate the Centennial of Flight (2003), the Adventures in Flight gallery offers a 15,000 square foot expansion which highlights commercial, civil and military aviation while exploring the origins of flight. A section tells the Wright Brothers' story through a series of interactive exhibits such as a full-scale reproduction of the Wright Flyer, the Wright Brothers' Bicycle Shop, a wind tunnel exhibit and a Wing Warper component.

The gallery's Commercial and Civil Aviation area features a full-size DC-9 with flight simulator. Check out the Test Flight Pre-show Theater, Flying Lab simulator, Propulsion Mini-Theater and A Day in the Life of a Suitcase. The Air Traffic Control area displays a real-time electronic map of North America showing all aircraft in flight. The Air Power Over Hampton Roads allows adventurous minds to build airplanes and a B-24 motion simulator provides the first-person experience of a World War II bomber.

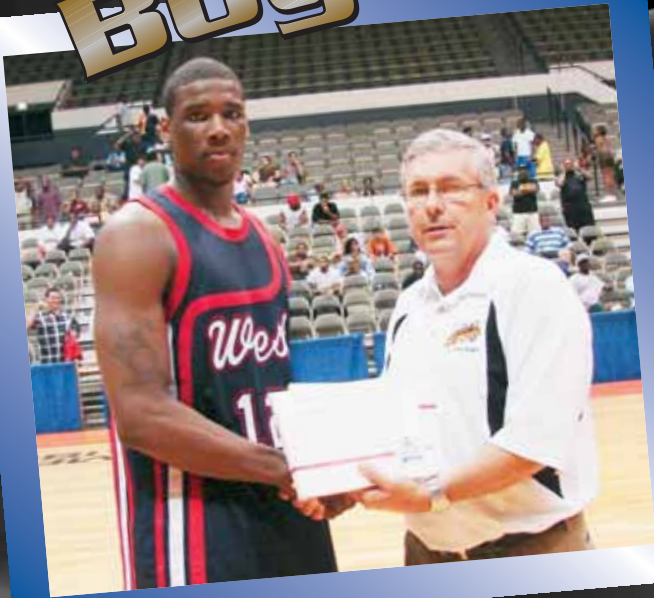

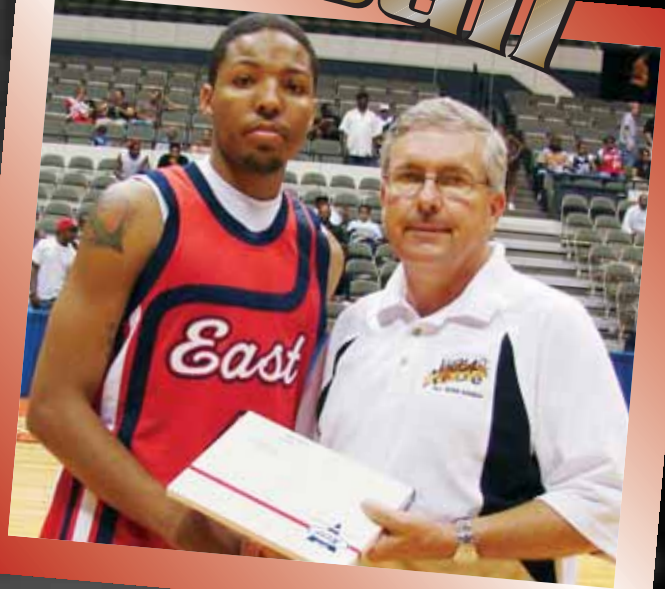

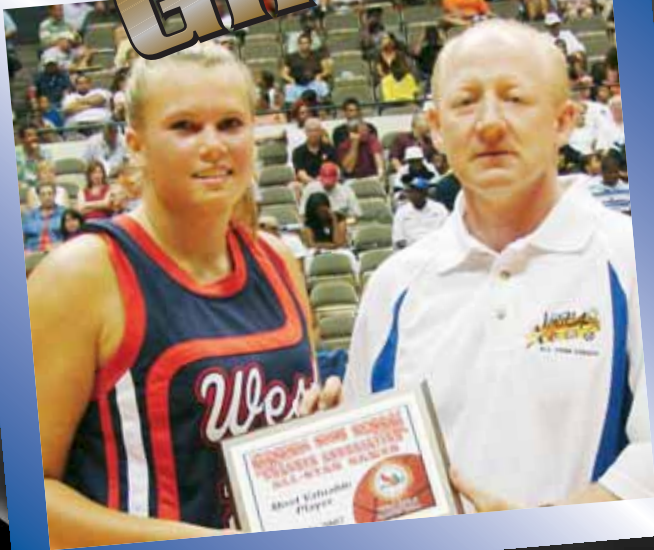

GENERAL CRITERIA

Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct, moral character, and carry the endorsement of their respective high school.

The categories of athlete, coach, and contributor are included on the nomination form for expediency in understanding the primary area in which an individual is to be considered for their achievements in interscholastic athletics and activities. The grouping is for screening purposes only and to assist those making the nominations in understanding the type of information required. Once nominees are inducted, they are not categorized, but all are recognized as members of the Virginia High School Hall of Fame.

To further explain, athletes would be former student participants who are being nominated for their achievements in interscholastic athletics. Coaches would be considered on the merits of their high school coaching achievements only. A contributor would be an individual who has made a contribution to interscholastic athletics or activities in some capacity other than those previously mentioned, including such areas as administration, sports, medicine, sports media, official, activities sponsor or participant, etc.

All candidates will be judged on their significant and/or long term contribution to interscholastic athletics and activities. While many have served their school and local programs over a long and distinguished career, their accomplishments must have been worthy of state recognition for them to be considered. Longevity, without meaningful state impact, does not constitute appropriate credentials for hall of fame consideration.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Coaches being considered must be retired or deceased with at least 20 years service in Virginia at a member school(s) or have served 25 years at a member school(s) and still actively coaching. Persons nominated as a contributor to the VHSL must meet similar criteria for a comparable period of time. If the candidate is a coach, the candidate must be a member of the Virginia State High School Coaches Association
- (b) Athletes are eligible for nomination 5 years after their high school graduation. Their nomination initially will be placed in a Inactive Category; 10 years after their high graduation, they will be placed in the Active Category and brought before the Screening Committee for consideration in the Hall of Fame.

METHODS OF NOMINATION

- (a) Any VHSCA member in good standing or VHSL member school may nominate.
- (b) The nominating deadline is Oct. 31, in the year prior to the year of induction.
- (c) No individual may make more than one nomination per year.
- (d) Nominations for candidates not selected shall remain open for consideration each of the next two years but will no longer be considered thereafter unless a new renomination is submitted.

Virginia High School HALL OF FAME

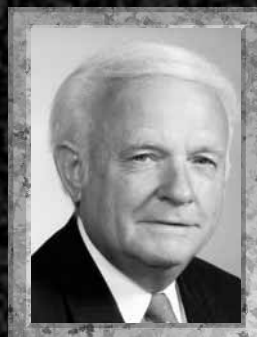


The Class of 2007 includes two coaches, three athletes and five contributors.

Ten individuals who have made outstanding contributions to high school activity programs will be honored on October 9 with membership in the Virginia High School Hall of Fame. Members of the Class of 2007, the 18th to be inducted, will bring total membership to 187.

Sponsored jointly by the Virginia High School League and the Virginia High School Coaches Association, the hall is dedicated to preserving the rich heritage of outstanding achievements by students and adults in sports and activities within Virginia's public high schools. Athletes are eligible for consideration 10 years after completion of their high school careers and are judged primarily for their achievements in interscholastic sports. Coaches are eligible after 15 years of experience or upon retirement and are judged on the merits of their achievements at the high school level. Contributors are professionals who have rendered significant services in some other capacity such as administration, academic activities, officiating, media, or sports medicine.

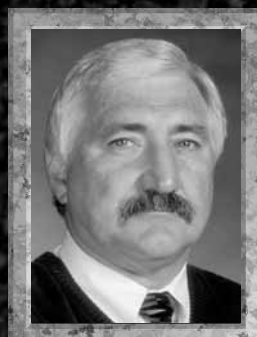


Wayne M. Cosby

Southampton High School

Wayne Cosby briefly coached football and basketball at Huguenot High School in Richmond before transferring to Southampton High School in Courtland. In fourteen years of coaching football at Southampton, Coach Cosby accrued a record consisting of 126 wins, 18 losses and two ties. Within those 126 wins are 69 consecutive wins. In the eight-year period between 1972 and 1979, his teams experienced a "super run," making it to the state championship every year

and dominating Group AA action by winning four state titles and finishing in the runner-up position in the other four years. Cosby was on the VHSCA All-Star coaching squad for eight consecutive years and has also been named Coach of the Year by several different associations. He retired from the Southampton County Public School system as an assistant principal in 1981 and has been serving as Southampton County Circuit Court Clerk ever since.



Dennis S. Kozlowski

Bethel High School

Accumulated from his 28 years as Bethel High School's outdoor track coach, Dennis Kozlowski has 75 individual state champions and three team titles (1977, 1984 and 1986) to his credit. "Coach Koz" also served as the school's head football coach for 25 years, finishing with a 172-86 record and state championship wins in 1974, 1976 and 1992. Under his leadership, the Bruins garnered three regional titles and five district titles. Six of his former players went on to successful careers in the NFL; two of them have

Super Bowl rings. Koz is a two-time Coach of the Year, a Peninsula Sports Club's Man of the Year and an inductee of the Luzerne County, PA Hall of Fame (Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association). He is currently the assistant football coach for the Newport News Shipbuilding football team.

Stephen Curry

Fort Defiance High School

Fort Defiance has two state championships. Dell Curry was on both teams. As a senior, he led the Indians to baseball glory. In basketball, his sport of choice, Dell set and still holds the school record for most points in a game, most points in a season, most points in a career, best scoring average in a career and most rebounds in a career, leading the team to the pinnacle of success with a state championship

as a sophomore. As a senior, he was selected as a National High School All-American, a McDonald's High School All-American and a Parade High School All-American. He received a scholarship to Virginia Tech in the fall of 1982, for which he continued to play both baseball and basketball. He was drafted by the major league Baltimore Orioles in 1985. In 1986, he began a 16-year career with the National Basketball Association's Utah Jazz. Dell is currently the Director of Player Development with the NBA's Charlotte Bobcats.

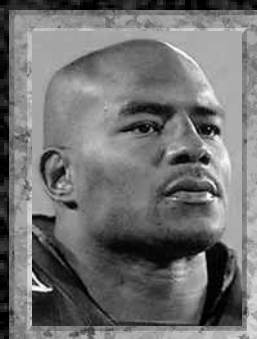


Terry Gayle Kirby

Tabb High School

Terry Kirby's high school football career as a running back included 104 touchdowns and 7,428 rushing yards; both were state records when they were achieved. His 26 consecutive 100-yard games and 36 career 100-yard games are state records to this day. His name continues to appear in the VHSL Record Book making 11 appearances, 10 in football and 1 in basketball. Kirby was also successful on the track and the baseball diamond. Named National Player of the Year by both Parade

Magazine and Gatorade Circle of Champions for football, Kirby continued his career at the University of Virginia where he was the Cavaliers' all-time leading rusher with 3,348 yards (now number three), 567 rushes and 24 touchdowns. Following college, he played 10 seasons in the National Football League with the Miami Dolphins, San Francisco 49ers, Cleveland Browns and Oakland Raiders.



Christopher Carroll Slade

Tabb High School

Chris Slade was an accomplished three-sport athlete while at Tabb High School. He ran track and played basketball, but the sport in which he excelled was football. Slade was on the 1987 state championship football team as a defensive end during his junior year. His 47 sacks was a school record, and he was later named USA Today All-American Defensive End. He continued as a defensive end at the University of Virginia where he was a four-year

starter and set UVA's records for single season sacks (15) and career sacks (40). He was a three-time All-ACC team member and was named National Defensive Player of the Year in 1992. Slade was first pick in the second round of the National Football League draft (New England), he played in Super Bowl XXXI and was twice named to the NFL Pro Bowl team.

Bruce Bowen has served the Virginia high school community for 15 years as a coach and 20 years as an athletic administrator. As a cross country and track coach, Bowen has 11 district titles, seven regional titles and one state championship title under his belt. As an athletic administrator, he directed 65 district, 22 regional and six state events; played a lead role in establishing cheer competition in the Colonial District, serving as Central Region chairman on the cheerleading

committee; served as VIAAA president; served on the VHSL Executive Committee; and co-chaired the VHSL Student Leadership Conference. The VHSCA has recognized Bowen's contributions by naming him Coach of the Year in 1982 and by presenting him with its Distinguished Service Award in 1993. Jerry Deviney has been shaping the lives of young people since 1964 when he was a teacher at Malibu Elementary School. Since then, his titles have not been limited to yearbook sponsor, SCA adviser, basketball coach, football coach, leadership workshop director, student activities coordinator, assistant principal, principal, first supervisor of student activities, area team director, director of secondary education and interim deputy superintendent. Deviney has also served on

the VHSL Executive Committee and is a member of both the Virginia and National Association of Secondary School Principals. Whether it was his assistance in the formation of the Beach District, his hosting of state soccer and gymnastic championships or his hosting highly acclaimed state and national student eadership conferences, the impact of Jerry Deviney's service reaches across the state of Virginia and beyond.



Dr. Carol Rae Chory, CMAA

Kempsville High School

Dr. Chory's influence has been felt way beyond the walls of Kempsville High School, where she has served as Student Activities Coordinator since 1979. Her relationship with VHSL goes back even further, beginning with her service as a state field hockey official in 1976, and spanning the years as a member of numerous committees including the Executive Committee, Tournament Committee,

Equity Committee, Student Leaders Conference Host Committee, Hall of Fame Selection Committee and Calendar Committee. She is a former VIAAA treasurer and president and also a Certified Master Athletic Administrator. On the national level, Dr. Chory has served the NIAAA as a state representative, Credentials Committee member and conference speaker. She has also been a delegate representing Section II within the National Federation of State High School Associations.

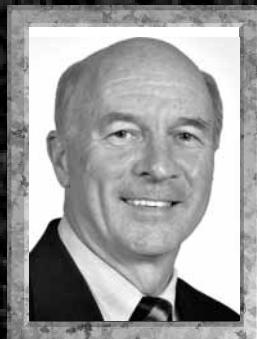


Sandra A. Hadaway, CMAA

All awards presented by the VHSCA are listed below and included are any special criteria for special awards. For coaching awards, the coach must be an active member of the VHSCA. The awards application is always in the Virginia Coach. Send duplicate applications for each award requested.

Note change in request procedure below!

I STATE CHAMPION RING AWARD

The VHSCA will present a ring to any active member head coach who has won two state championships in the same sport. Recipients need to submit the awards application form with ring size, stone, and verified two state championship years. There is no charge for the ring. Failure to attend and receive the ring at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$25.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1. A head coach can receive only one state championship ring. However, additional rings may be purchased.

II STATE CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested. There is no charge. Failure to attend and receive the plaque at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$10.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

III STATE RUNNER-UP AND REGIONAL CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$12.00 per plaque. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

IV DISTRICT CHAMPION CERTIFICATES

The certificates must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$3.00 per certificate. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

V DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Four of these awards can be given each year (one per four areas of state). The only criteria is to submit a written nomination to the Awards Chairman.

VI FRANK McCUE SPORTS MEDICINE AWARD

This award is presented each year to a doctor or trainer who has made outstanding contributions to high school athletics. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

VII MARSHALL JOHNSON NEWS MEDIA AWARD

This award is presented each year to an outstanding high school sports journalist. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

VIII JIMMIE BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Three \$1,000.00 scholarships are awarded each year to outstanding high school senior student-athletes. Information, deadlines, and application forms will be in the October and February issues of Virginia Coach.

X STATE COACHES OF THE YEAR (CAREER) AWARDS

During the July meeting of the VHSCA Legislative council, the Sports Interest Groups select fifteen coaches and one athletic director as State Coaches of the Year (Career) and Virginia's nominees for National Coach of the Year. The fifteen sports are football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, boy's track, girl's track, baseball, wrestling, swimming, volleyball, cross country, softball, soccer, golf, tennis, and special sports (gymnastics). The nominees enter competition for Regional and National Coach of the Year (Career) honors. These coaches are also honored at the Awards Banquet at our summer clinic with a State Coach of the Year (Career) Plaque.

XI ALL-STAR COACHES AWARDS

At our summer clinic Awards Banquet, our football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball and boy's soccer All-Star coaches are presented a plaque.

XII COACHES CAREER AWARD

Coaches are recognized after 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 (and so on) years service in the coaching profession. Combined head and assistant coaching experience is considered. To be considered for these awards, a coach must be an active or lifetime member of the VHSCA. Five years of service must be in a Virginia High School League member school.

- Step 1 The 10 year award is a certificate.
- Step 2 The 15 year award is a pin and certificate.
- Step 3 The 20 year award is a 7" x 9" plaque.
- Step 4 The 25 year award is a 8" x 10" plaque.
- Step 5 The 30 year award is a ring or plaque or engraved serving tray (recipients choice).
- Step 6 The 35 year is a 12" x 15" plaque.
- Step 7 The 40 year award is a desk or mantle walnut clock.

***NO RETROACTIVE AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN BEFORE STEP 5.**

***Awards for state champions, all ring recipients, steps four and above for milestone, and 25 year and up for career awards will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques and \$25.00 for rings and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.**

- 1) For sports such as baseball, basketball, football soccer, softball, tennis, volleyball, and field hockey; all wins in regular season, district playoffs, regional playoffs, and state playoffs may be counted.
- 2) For sports such as cross country, golf, gymnastics, indoor track, swimming, outdoor track, and wrestling; the procedure is different. Team victories in dual, tri, and quad meets can be counted. For regular season invitational meets or tournaments involving five or more teams, district championships, regional championships, and state championships; only the first place team will have one victory or win. A second place team finish or lower will not count as a win for this award.

* All wins must be as a head coach of a specific varsity sport at a Virginia High School League Member School.

* Criteria established so it is possible to reach a new level in approximately six years.

* Boys and girls sports are considered separately. (example: If you coach boys and girls tennis, you are technically coaching **two** sports.)

* To be considered for the "Victory Milestone Award," a coach must be an active member or lifetime member of the VHSCA and must send a written request for the award to the VHSCA Awards Chairman. Certification of wins by your principal is required.

* Award will not be retroactive. (Example: If first request is after you have achieved Step 3, you will receive only the award for Step 3—Step 1 and Step 2 awards would not be given).

* Awards beginning with Step 4 will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques or \$25.00 for rings, pendants, and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

3) For sports such as golf that has a season running tournament the entire season counts the number of wins and losses by the way they finish at the end (accumulation).



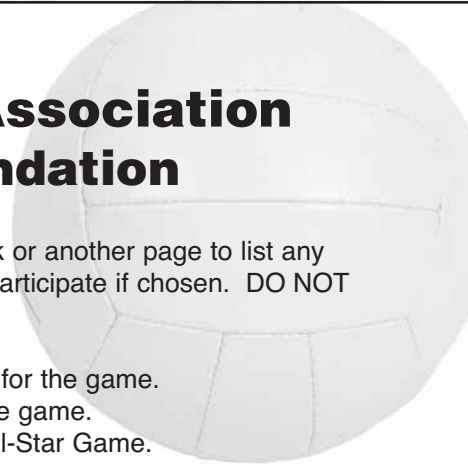

Communicating With Athletes and Their Readiness to Change

BRENT STEUERWALD, M.A., is the head football coach at Shenendehowa High School (Clifton Park, N.Y.) and the 1995 National Coach of the Year.

The success of any coach, at perhaps every level of competition, is determined by his ability to effectively communicate with athletes in a mutually supporting manner. Coaches may be knowledgeable and highly organized, but without open communication skills, these attributes may never be reflected in the performance of their athletes. The following points of consideration may help coaches develop their capacity to effect desired change.

- 1. Role Definition** - Give every athlete a sense of how he or she fits into the big picture. By recognizing the role each player contributes to the team, coaches can give an athlete a sense of worth and achievement. A coach should instill in every team member a sense that they can improve their status by hard work and commitment.
 - 2. Set Goals** - Encourage athletes to set realistic and measurable goals, and communicate how to achieve them. Discuss the differences between individual and team goals and the need to sometimes sacrifice personal goals for team objectives. The ability to set goals with a sense of purpose is a life skill that will help athletes beyond their sport.
 - 3. Mutual Trust** - Positive relationships are built on mutual respect and trust. Athletes must know that they can depend on their coach to be fair and positive, even in intense competition. Coaches can criticize but must leave personality out of it. Criticism must be constructive, positive, consistent, and oriented around improving performance. No player improves when made to feel worse about himself.
 - 4. Empower Athletes** - Within the context of a disciplined and structured environment, coaches should empower their athletes to make decisions and control various aspects of a contest. Coaches should thoroughly teach concepts with each athlete understanding his part. Then, charge athletes to execute their part by making adjustments on the run and communicating problems with the coaches. Responsibility and authority must go hand in hand.
 - 5. Fuel Athletes** - Athletes will not be able to perform mentally and physically without the proper foods and fluids. Coaches should team up with registered dietitians and athletic trainers to educate their athletes about food and fluid selections that focus on carbohydrates, because carbohydrates are the primary fuel for athletes. Fluids, such as sports drinks, offer athletes more than water. Sports drinks replace fluids and electrolytes lost in sweat and put back carbohydrate energy. Properly fueled athletes are able to perform at a higher level mentally.
 - 6. Develop a Plan** - Coaches must plan for communication opportunities just as they plan for game structure. Opportunities for communication can be as simple as searching out an athlete after a difficult practice and asking if he understands the reasons for the criticisms given. Athletes can only apply coaching guidance insofar as they understand what is desired of them. An excellent technique for developing lines of communication is a season-end interview of all returning athletes. A coach can engage an athlete in 20 questions in a quiet environment so that the athlete feels that the coach is interested in him as a person. The coach should be willing to accept and evaluate dissent when appropriate.
 - 7. Caring and Approval** - Coaches must consistently remind athletes that caring isn't conditional, approval is. Caring about athletes as individuals creates confidence in the coaches' support that allows them to grow as athletes and as people. Coaches must avoid coaching a fear of failure into their methods of communication, and encourage risk-taking as an integral part of athletic competition.
- Overall, effective communication skills can have a dramatic impact on coach-player relationships. Creating the atmosphere in which positive changes can be attained can pay great dividends for coaches and athletes alike.
