President's Message

Hopefully, you had a very relaxing break and are now ready to tackle the demands of the winter season. There is also a great deal to report upon since our fall newsletter.

Tackling our Budget Deficit

While we wish that our budget deficit no longer existed, unfortunately it still does. The Officers and the Executive Council are working very hard at reducing it and to set a course of action so this will not become a recurring problem.

Why does our budget deficit exist? That's not a simple question to answer. Over the last three years, the cost of hosting our annual conference in Ocean City has increased roughly \$5,000 per year. Also during this time, all member state associations were asked to send their LTC Coordinator to two national meetings. Next, the NIAAA suggested that states should add a second LTC Coordinator. With the flights and lodging, these LTC meetings mean increased expenditures that we simply haven't had in the past. ...And these are only two examples.

In simple terms, our costs have escalated and our income has remained static. Therefore, we have engaged in a cost-cutting process in which we look at every expense and ways we might be able to reduce or eliminate them. We also have entered into some new sponsorship deals and creative fund raising attempts in order to move our balance from the red to the black.

However, we still need your help! That's right, we really need contributions from each and every one of you. If everyone would contribute in a small way, we can overcome this hurdle.

- Please consider having your booster club, school or other professional organization sign up as a Professional Sponsor. This program operates very much like that of patron ads for a high school play program. Currently, we have 7 schools and 2 professional organizations and one business on board.
- Bring along your checkbook to our annual conference (obviously, you first have to register and attend the conference)! Gene Rotberg will be conducting a silent auction in order to help us raise some additional revenue.

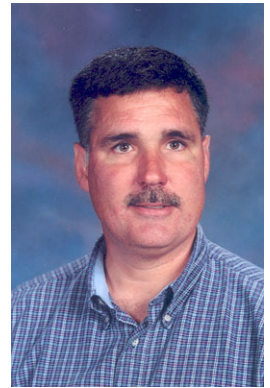

SIMPLE WAYS TO PROMOTE ACADEMIC SUCCESS BY YOUR ATHLETES

Karl Heimbach, CAA — Athletic Director at Magruder High School

It is probably not surprising to those involved in athletics that athletes also tend to be some of the most successful students in the classroom. Our two varsity soccer teams have both been recognized by the NSCAA for the past four years for the “High School Academic Team Award” (team G.P.A. of 3.25 or better) and many of our athletes have earned academic scholarships to various universities and colleges. In an effort to promote academics at Magruder High School, we have instituted these awards and programs to showcase academic excellence and help student-athletes who might be struggling.



Academic Awards:

1. We award a special pin for the varsity letter when the athlete earns a varsity letter in two different sports and maintains a 3.5 G.P.A for the first three quarters of each academic year.
2. We award the certificate from the M.P.S.S.A.A. “Minds in Motion Program” to junior varsity and varsity athletes who maintain a 3.25 G.P.A. during the season.
3. We started a competition between the three gender based athletic programs at Magruder High School for the program who has the highest overall G.P.A. after the first three quarters. Both the junior varsity and varsity teams for that particular program is calculated and a certificate is given to each member of the winning program and the teams name is placed on a plaque in the trophy showcase.

Male Sports-soccer, football, wrestling, baseball, tennis, volleyball, lacrosse, and basketball.

Female Sports- basketball, field hockey, lacrosse, volleyball, soccer, tennis, poms and softball.

Coed Sports-golf, cheerleading, cross country, swimming, indoor track, outdoor track, and coed volleyball.

Academic Support for Student Athletes:

1. An “Athletic Academic Advisor” who passes out grade sheets every three weeks and records the grade sheets in a sports log notebook after the parent has signed the grade sheet and the coach has reviewed the athletes grades for that three week period of time. Coaches can request that the grade sheets continue after the season is over if academic problems persist.
2. The “Athletic Academic Advisor” notifies the coach of all failing grades of each athlete and recommends either during/ after school help for the athletes in danger.
3. The “Athletic Academic Advisor” often calls home or arranges additional support by having students enrolled in the ASSIT program that is offered at our school.
4. The “Athletic Academic Advisor” allows for individual help during the school day in her room and seeks feedback from teachers on how various athletes are doing and if improvement is being witnessed.
5. Besides the role of the “Athletic Academic Advisor”, our school offers tutoring from the National Honor Society, homework help from the Homework Club, and additional help in the After School Tutoring Center.

We have seen great improvement in reducing the number of student-athletes who become ineligible at the end of each grading period by using the “Athletic Academic Advisor.” Our goal at Magruder High School is to promote the academic success of our student-athletes and offer additional support to those who might need the extra help.

LTC 501 – Athletic Administration: Philosophy, Leadership Organizations and Professional Programs

This flagship course of Leadership Training serves as an overview for the Certified Athletic Administrator Examination. Topics discussed include: NFHS, NIAAA, Legal Issues, Communication, Budgets, Technology and Leadership Styles. The course also previews the NIAAA Certification Program and the Leadership Training Program. It is a prerequisite for all levels of certification. A student manual is included. \$_____

LTC 520 – Athletic Administration: Character in Coaching

For your school’s athletic program to be truly character-based, it is essential that the school’s stakeholders (athletic director, principal, superintendent, school board and parents) act on the established core virtues in the mission statement of the athletic department. When professional stakeholders walk the talk, their actions speak volumes to the student-athletes and the community at-large. This course provides administrators with a “full stakeholder” approach to make the athletic department mission come alive on the athletic field. The course is interactive, full of useful activities and provides administrators with a template ready to use back in their home school. The course is based on the book “Character and Coaching - Building Virtue in Your Athletic Program” by John Yeager. This text is included as a course resource. \$_____

Friday, April 30th 8:00am – 12:00pm

LTC 502 – Athletic Administration Principles, Strategies and Methods

This course will take a basic approach to the fundamentals and methods of athletic administration and will alert and educate athletic administrators regarding potential problems and possible solutions in areas such as budgets, transportation, scheduling and parent/student/coach conflicts. The course will also touch upon sample athletic/activity program philosophies, department organizational charts, activity procedures/checklists, public relations, coaching applications/assessments and emergency plans. Course materials, as well as the manual “Athletic Administration: A Comprehensive Guide” are included. \$_____

LTC 516 – Athletic Administration: Administration of Physical Plant Assets

This course will complement LTC 515, which focuses on outdoor assets and athletic turf enhancement. As such, LTC 516 will consider spectator facilities, special use gymnasias, natatoriums, laundry rooms and locker rooms along with various systems that support these facilities. Mechanical system checklists for use in regular inspections and maintenance programming will be provided. In addition, considerations and issues related to construction and remodeling programs will be discussed. \$_____
