



Greetings from Hampton!



Whether your idea of fun is a day full of activity or a leisurely boat ride, Hampton is a champion among cities! Although the 2008 Annual Clinic and All-Star Games' schedule will keep you busy with seminars and athletic events, there will be plenty of time for you to see the sights and have some fun in Hampton—America's oldest continuous English-speaking settlement.

There is never a shortage of fun in Hampton Roads center attraction! There are more than

**100 area attractions** within minutes of us. Your family is sure to enjoy the new *Adventures in Flight Gallery* at the Virginia Air & Space Center, The Cousteau Society, the Hampton History Museum, Bass Pro Shops and much more.

Surrounding area attractions include Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia Beach, Busch Gardens, harbor tours on the largest natural harbor in the world, and water sports on the Chesapeake Bay. Our region is rich in colonial, Civil War, African American and aviation history!



The Virginia Air and Space Museum exhibits many of NASA's most dramatic space artifacts, including the Apollo 12 Command Module, a Viking Mars Lander, satellites, space suits, and moon rocks. The center also houses a dozen aircraft, the Hampton Roads History Center, and southeastern Virginia's only IMAX theater.



# Hampton Attractions

## AIR POWER PARK

Learn about Hampton's space and aviation history by touring the outdoor air and spacecraft displays, model airplane collection and wind tunnel exhibit at Air Power Park. Home to one of the largest civilian-owned collections of aircraft and missiles in the United States, Air Power Park contains aircraft from the country's various service branches, including a Nike surface-to-air missile, a P-1127 Kestrel vertical-lift jet and an F-100D Super Sabre, the first Air Force fighter with true supersonic performance.

## BASS PRO SHOPS (OUTDOOR WORLD)

Located at Pine Chapel Road and I-64, Bass Pro Shops® Outdoor World® is much more than a hunting and fishing store, Bass Pro Shops also offers equipment for hiking, backpacking, camping, outdoor cooking and more. Shoppers will also find outdoor apparel for men, women and children, along with a fine selection of casual and athletic footwear. A gift and nature shop serves up a wide variety of outdoor-related items from lamps and dishes to bird feeders and furniture.

Unique exterior and interior motifs have branded Bass Pro Shops stores as Visually appealing, high quality outdoor stores. The outdoor feel is brought indoors through massive log and rock work, aquariums and water features, as well as an extensive collections of fish and wildlife exhibits all helping to maximize the experience of the outdoor enthusiast.

A large atrium inside showcases an impressive 30' rock mountain climbing wall, fashioned to resemble a rock bluff from the Roanoke Valley. A cascading waterfall tumbles down into a 19,000-gallon aquarium stocked with striped bass, catfish and crappie. The aquarium is also home to lunker largemouth bass. Trees plus other plants and wildlife native to Virginia can be seen on the rock ledges and crevices.

## BEACHES AND FISHING

Buckroe Beach, located along Hampton's Chesapeake Bay shoreline, is a popular family beach. The beach officially opens Memorial Day weekend and closes Labor Day weekend. Lifeguards are on duty during the official season. Visitors are invited to enjoy the playground, in-water craft available for rent, guided beach explorer programs. Don't miss the evening entertainment on Tuesdays and Sundays during the summer season.

Grandview Nature Preserve and Beach, located off Beach Road, is ideal for wildlife observations, ecological studies and hiking. Grandview's 578 acres of marshland include a beach that stretches for more than two miles. Educational tours and guided canoe/kayak excursions through the preserve are offered.

Charter fishing boats depart from Down Hampton Public Piers, the foot of King Street, Salt Ponds Marina and Wallace's Marina at Dandy Point for excursions on the Chesapeake Bay. Several head boats offer fishing excursions and charters year-round.

## HAMPTON HISTORY MUSEUM

Opened in May 2003, the Hampton History Museum interprets Hampton's unique past spanning from its inhabitation by the Kecoughtan Indians to the 20th century and the city's role as the birthplace of American space program. The center's ten galleries spotlight events in the city's history including the arrival of Captain John Smith and the first settlers, the demise of Blackbeard the Pirate, and the emergence of Hampton's seafood industry, establishing the city as "Crabtown." A changing gallery on the second floor hosts visiting historic and pop culture exhibits. The museum also houses the Hampton Visitor Center.

## MISS HAMPTON II HARBOR CRUISES

A double-decked tour boat, the Miss Hampton II carries passengers out to the Hampton Roads harbor and Chesapeake Bay. On this narrated tour, visitors will cruise past Blackbeard's Point, Hampton University, Old Point Comfort and the Norfolk Naval Base, where they'll get a look at the mighty ships and submarines berthed at the world's largest naval base. A highlight of the cruise is a stop at Fort Wool, where passengers disembark for a guided tour of this island fortification.

## VIRGINIA AIR & SPACE CENTER

The official visitor center for NASA Langley Research facilities, the Virginia Air & Space Center and Hampton Roads History Center houses a spectacular collection of flight- and space-related artifacts, interactive exhibits, historical displays and a giant-screen, 3-D IMAX® Theater. Visitors can see a three-billion-year-old moon rock, collected during the Apollo 17 mission; the Apollo 12 Command Module that journeyed to the moon and back; and a replica of the Lunar Orbiter, which mapped the moon's surface for future landings. The Cosmic Café offers food and be sure to browse the gift shop.

Unveiled in time to celebrate the Centennial of Flight (2003), the Adventures in Flight gallery offers a 15,000 square foot expansion which highlights commercial, civil and military aviation while exploring the origins of flight. A section tells the Wright Brothers' story through a series of interactive exhibits such as a full-scale reproduction of the Wright Flyer, the Wright Brothers' Bicycle Shop, a wind tunnel exhibit and a Wing Warper component.

The gallery's Commercial and Civil Aviation area features a full-size DC-9 with flight simulator. Check out the Test Flight Pre-show Theater, Flying Lab simulator, Propulsion Mini-Theater and A Day in the Life of a Suitcase. The Air Traffic Control area displays a real-time electronic map of North America showing all aircraft in flight. The Air Power Over Hampton Roads allows adventurous minds to build airplanes and a B-24 motion simulator provides the first-person experience of a World War II bomber.

# WILLIAM H. "BILL" LITTLEPAGE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Winningest basketball coach in VHSL Group AAA history (755 wins) and second in the VHSL overall
- One of only two coaches to ever win over 700 games at a Virginia High School League (VHSL) school
- Forty-four (44) years as head basketball coach at Hopewell (734-298 .711)
- Two years head coach in King & Queen County/Marriott High School (16-16); one year in Caroline County/C.T. Smith High School (5-6)
- Total years head coach - 47 (755-320 .702)
- Guided teams to 26 VHSL Regional Tournament berths and six State Tournaments, including the state title in 1972 and runner-up in 1986 and 1996
- Teams finished first in the final Associated Press State AAA Poll in 1971 and 1985 and second in 1986, 1987, 1997, 2000

Littlepage, who is in his 35th year coaching at Hopewell and his 38th season overall, became the winningest coach in Virginia High School League history with a 66-55 victory over Meadowbrook on Jan. 16. He has an overall record of 607-238, including one state championship.

## **Mike Rhoades** Head Basketball Coach Randolph-Macon College

Mike Rhoades just completed his ninth season as the head men's basketball coach at Randolph-Macon College in 2007-08. His overall career record is 177-71 (.713).

From 1996 to 1999 Rhoades served as an assistant coach at Randolph-Macon, and took over the reigns of the program from the legendary Hal Nunnally following the 1998-99 season.

A native of Pennsylvania, Rhoades is a 1995 graduate of Lebanon Valley College, where he was a standout player on the basketball court. Rhoades helped his team to league titles, conference championships, and the NCAA Division III title in 1994. Individually, he was named a four-time conference all-star, two-time Middle Atlantic Region Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year, MVP of the 1994 National Championship, first-team All-American, and National Player of the Year. His jersey number, #5, was retired at the end of his senior year. Rhoades received the highest athletic honor at LVC, by being inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

Because of his background both as a player and as a coach, Rhoades has a deep understanding of the great tradition and history of Randolph-Macon basketball.

"Randolph-Macon College basketball has had a tremendous tradition," he says. "We are known throughout the country for the type of team we put on the court. I take great pride in continuing the tradition as well as striving to push forward." Rhoades demands respect from his players, and excellence both on and off the court if they want to be a successful part of the Yellow Jacket program.

"We will keep demanding a first-class program with gentlemen both on and off the court. Our goals are to keep playing the best teams possible and to recruit young men who will put the program before themselves. Our work ethic will make our college community and former players proud of what they are a part of," Rhoades states.



## **Jim Cavanaugh** Assistant Football Coach Virginia Tech

Jim Cavanaugh has played a major role in Virginia Tech's success since joining Frank Beamer's coaching staff in 1996. Cavanaugh is entering his 12th season as the Hokies strong safety and outside linebackers coach and his 6th as

recruiting coordinator.

No one has been more instrumental in bringing top-notch talent to the Tech program than Cavanaugh.

Over the past nine years, his recruiting skills have helped the Hokies attract, among others, prep All-Americans Michael Vick, Nathaniel Adibi, Bryan Randall, Jonathan Lewis, Marcus Vick, Xavier Adibi and Chris Ellis. Along with his success in attracting talent, Coach Cav has been instrumental in helping players develop their talent once they join the Tech program.

A former wide receiver at William & Mary, he is a veteran of 37 years coaching, including 33 as a full-time coach on the collegiate level. He has worked at two other Virginia schools – VMI and the University of Virginia – during his career and has been on the staff of five ACC schools – NC State, UVA, Maryland, North Carolina and Virginia Tech.



## **Curt Newsome** Assistant Football Coach Virginia Tech

Curt Newsome is beginning his third season as the offensive line coach for the Hokies. Prior to his arrival in Blacksburg, he was an assistant coach at James Madison University for seven seasons. A familiar face in the Virginia high

school ranks, he is also one of the top recruiters in the region, helping sign prep All-American Tyrod Taylor in 2007.

Prior to joining the JMU staff, Newsome was head coach in 1998 at Heritage High School in Newport News, where he was the AP Virginia Scholastic Coach of the Year. He was head coach at Kecoughtan from 1987-97 and also coached at Phoebus and Ervinton high schools.



## **Oliver Weiss** Head Soccer Coach Virginia Tech

Since his arrival at Virginia Tech in 2002, Head Coach Oliver Weiss has elevated the men's soccer program into the national spotlight by achieving unprecedented postseason success, recruiting outstanding student-

athletes and creating a soccer environment that demands excellence in every aspect of collegiate athletics.

Weiss six-year record of 68-39-16, reflects not only a strong tradition, but also a character and confidence building experience because of Virginia Tech's extraordinarily strong schedules. In 2007, they reached the NCAA semi-finals before losing to ACC rival Wake Forest 2-0.

A 1987 graduate of the University of Richmond where he was an outstanding player, Weiss previous coaching stops include University of New Hampshire, College of William & Mary, and University of North Carolina.

**Mike London**  
Head Football Coach  
University of Richmond

Director of Athletics Jim Miller introduced Mike London as the University of Richmond's 33rd head football coach on January 19, 2008. A 1983 Richmond graduate of Richmond, London has both played and coached for the Spiders.

London, 47, has spent six of the past seven seasons molding one of the nation's top defenses at the University of Virginia, most recently as the Cavaliers' defensive coordinator. He returned to Charlottesville in 2006 after spending the previous season as the defensive line coach with the NFL's Houston Texans. London was a member of Al Groh's original staff at UVa from 2001-04, coaching the defensive line. He was also the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning All-State honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London broke into the coaching ranks in 1988, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison. He then spent four years (1990-93) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary in addition he has coached at Boston College. London has also served for two years as a detective in the street crimes unit for the City of Richmond Police Department.

**Jeff Mullen**  
Offensive Coordinator/QB's Coach  
West Virginia University



Jeff Mullens joins the Mountaineer staff as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach after serving as the quarterbacks coach at Wake Forest for the past four years.

The past two seasons, he tutored QB Riley Skinner, who completed a school-record 72.4% of his passes to lead the nation in completion percentage. Skinner led the Demon Deacons to 20 wins over the past two seasons (11 in 2006 and 9 in 2007), an Atlantic Coast Conference championship in 2006 and a Meineke Car Care Bowl victory in 2007.

Prior to his stint at Wake Forest, Mullen enjoyed being part of Jim Grobe's staff at Ohio University for nine years.



**Chris Beatty**  
Running Backs Coach  
West Virginia University

Chris Beatty comes to West Virginia after having served as running backs coach at Northern Illinois last year.

Prior to NIU, Beatty was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Hampton University, where he helped the Pirates to a 10-2 overall record and a spot in the NCAA playoffs in 2006.

Before the 2006 season at Hampton, Beatty was a highly successful high school coach in Virginia who compiled a 78-18 record at three different schools. At his final prep stop at Landstown HS, he compiled a 40-2 mark and led the Eagles to three consecutive AAA championship games. They won the title in 2004 when Beatty was named AAA Coach of the Year.



**John Trudgeon**  
Wrestling Coach  
VMI

Since taking the reins of the Keydet wrestling program in 1985, head coach John Trudgeon has progressively raised the benchmarks of success surrounding VMI wrestling. Southern Conference Championships, NCAA qualifiers, and All-Americans - all are now standard phrases used in connection with Trudgeon's wrestlers.

During his 22 seasons as head coach, Trudgeon has posted a dual record of 144-160-4. He is a four-time Southern Conference Coach of the Year - 1994, 1995, 1999 and 2000 - and he has three times been named Virginia Coach of the Year, in 1993, 1994 and 2004.

Trudgeon, a 1975 graduate of William & Mary with a B.S. in physical education, was a three-year starter for the Tribe and qualified for the NCAA Division I tournament his senior season.

He came to VMI after serving as head wrestling coach at Lafayette High School in Williamsburg, Va., for eight seasons. During his tenure, his squads won district titles in 1982 and 1983, and placed third in the Virginia AAA tournament in 1982. He was the Peninsula District Coach of the Year in 1982, and coached six AAA state champions.



**Teague Moore**  
Head Wrestling Coach  
Clarion University

Teague Moore, 31, a native of Pittsburgh, Pa. (Wexford), a 1995 graduate of North Allegheny High, an NCAA Champion at Oklahoma State, and an accomplished international wrestler and coach,

has completed his second year at Clarion. He was named head coach on May 15, 2006.

Moore came to Clarion from Harvard University, where he was an assistant coach for one season. He was an assistant at Oklahoma State in 2003-0, at Oklahoma in 2002-03 and at Pitt from 2000-01.

At North Allegheny High School Teague was a three-time PIAA placewinner including a runner-up in 1993, a third place ending in 1994 and State Champion in 1995. He also was a three-time Pennsylvania State Freestyle Champion (1993-95), a three-time Junior National Freestyle Champion (1993, 94, 95) and National High School Champion in 1995.

Heading to Oklahoma State to wrestle under coach John Smith, Teague was a four-year starter at 118-pounds for the Cowboys. A 4-time NCAA Division I National Qualifier, he was a three-time Division I All-American (1997-99), including an NCAA National Championship in 1998. He pinned Michigan State's Dave Morgan in the finals to win his title. He also placed third at nationals in 1999 and 4th in 1997. Teague was a Big 12 Champion in 1997 and 98 and runner-up in 1999. He posted a career record of 118-25 and was 15th in career wins at Oklahoma State at that time.



**Ray Hedrick**  
Baseball Coach  
Randolph-Macon College

Ray Hedrick completed his third season at Randolph-Macon College and 10th overall as a college baseball coach in the spring of 2007.

In just three seasons as head baseball coach at R-MC, Hedrick has led the Jackets to several team and individual honors. Along with tying a school record for wins in the spring of 2006, Hedrick's team reached the ODAC tournament for the first time in nine seasons. When R-MC qualified for the ODAC Tournament in 2007, it marked just the first time the program had done so in back-to-back seasons since 1991 and 1992.

The success of the program over the past three seasons has led to seven All-Conference players, including the 2006 ODAC Pitcher and the ODAC Rookie-of-the-Year award winners.

Prior to his hiring as Randolph-Macon's head coach, Hedrick was the top assistant to Paul O'Neil at Division II UNC Pembroke (2001-2004) and at Division III Shenandoah University (1998-2000). At both institutions, Hedrick helped O'Neil resurrect programs that had not tasted success in years into national powers, while quickly establishing himself as one of the top young coaches and recruiters among the college baseball coaching ranks.

A Springfield, Virginia native, Hedrick played two years of JUCO baseball at Prince George's Community College for legendary coach William "Bumps" Vaughan. He went on to finish his degree and playing career at

Randolph-Macon College, helping lead the Yellow Jackets to the ODAC championships in 1997, which was the last time that R-MC qualified for the tournament before last spring.



**Ted Wade**  
Assistant Volleyball Coach  
University of Virginia

Ted Wade is in his first year with the Cavalier volleyball program.

Wade comes to Virginia from the Junior Volleyball Association of Austin, where he was the associate director. He was also a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Texas and has been involved with the USA Volleyball High Performance programs for several years.

Wade has been an assistant coach with the USA Youth and Junior National Teams for over six years, where he has posted an 18-5 overall record. The past five summers, he has been an assistant for 30 international matches at two NORCECA Championships and two Under-18 World Championships.

As an assistant coach on the 2006 U.S. Women's Junior National Team, Wade saw the team win gold at the NORCECA Under-20 Championships in Monterrey, Mexico, and then take fourth at the World Championships in Nakhonratchasima, Thailand. His 2004 squad won the gold medal at the NORCECA Under-18 Championships in Puerto Rico, before finishing fourth at World Championships in Macau, China. He was also a part of the 2003 Under-18 team that took fourth at the World Championships in Pila, Poland.

As a CAP Level II certified coach, Wade has served on the USA Junior Olympic Championships computer staff for nine years. He has also been a member of USAV High Performance Tryouts since 1998. Each December from 2002-06, Wade coached at the USAV High Performance Holiday Camp. He was also selected as a two-time guest coach with the Senior National Team, under head coach Toshi Yoshida.

In his time with the Longhorns, he saw the team win the 1997 Big 12 Championship and share the 2007 title with Nebraska, in addition to reaching the NCAA Regional Finals both years. He was also a two-year head coach of Texas' men's club volleyball team, leading them to a fifth place finish at nationals in 1995.



**Angel Elderkin**  
Assistant Women's  
Basketball Coach  
University of Virginia

Angel Elderkin is coming off her first season on the Virginia sidelines as part of a Cavalier coaching staff that led the 2007-08 squad to the second round of the

NCAA Tournament, a 20-win season and a No. 22 final national ranking. Elderkin's responsibilities include recruiting, opponent scouting, player development, on-court instruction and practice and game preparation.

Prior to arriving in Charlottesville, Elderkin spent two seasons with the Tennessee Lady Volunteers, the 2007 National Champions, and four years as an assistant coach Siena College. Her experience also includes a two-year coaching stint at East Tennessee State.

Elderkin spent her playing days at Southern Maine, where she was a four-year letterwinner at guard and led the Huskies to three Little East Conference championships and an astounding 104-15 overall record.



**Dave Leitao**  
Head Men's Basketball Coach  
University of Virginia

The Virginia men's basketball team has participated in postseason play in each of Dave Leitao's three seasons as head coach and the Cavaliers have compiled an overall record of 53-42. Leitao was selected the Atlantic Coast Conference

Coach of the Year in 2007 when Virginia tied for the 2006-07 ACC regular season championship, advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and compiled an overall record of 21-11. He is the first UVA men's basketball coach to earn ACC Coach of the Year honors since Terry Holland in 1982.

In Leitao's first season at Virginia in 2005-06, the Cavaliers finished the regular season tied for seventh in the ACC standings after being picked to finish last in the 12-team conference during the preseason. UVA finished the season with an overall record of 15-15 and participated in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT).

In 2007-08, Virginia compiled an overall record of 17-16 and advanced to the semifinals of the inaugural College Basketball Invitational.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Virginia, Leitao was the head coach at DePaul for three years (2002-05). His DePaul teams compiled an overall record of 58-34 and participated in postseason play each season. The Blue Demons advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and twice participated in the NIT. He was also the head coach at Northeastern for two years (1994-96).

His overall record in eight years as a collegiate head coach is 133-111.

Leitao also worked as an assistant coach and associate head coach under Jim Calhoun at Northeastern and Connecticut for 16 years. His first coaching position was as an assistant to Calhoun at Northeastern for two years (1984-86). He later served as an assistant coach for eight years (1986-94) and as associate head coach for six years (1996-2002) under Calhoun at Connecticut.



**Betsy Blöse**  
Head Women's Basketball Coach  
UNC Asheville

Betsy Blöse begins her sixth year as head coach of the UNC Asheville women's basketball program. Last season, Blöse led the Bulldogs to their first ever Big South Championship and first appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Blöse has produced four-straight winning seasons coming off a Division I record 21 victories in 2006-07. Last season, she became the winningest coach in UNC Asheville women's basketball history and has moved into the top 10 in the Big South with 76 wins over her first five years.

2006-07 was special for more than just the championship. The Dogs ran off six-straight victories including the first victory at Liberty since the 1989-90 season. Asheville also picked up its first victory over an ACC school with a 58-53 win at Wake Forest. Asheville not only set a school record for wins but also set records for most points, most free throws made and attempted, most three-pointers made and attempted, and most blocked shots in a season.

The 2003-04 season was one of the best stories in college basketball. UNC Asheville finished with a 19-9 overall record and posted an amazing 16-game improvement over the previous season's 3-25 mark. The Bulldogs were the most improved team in the nation and their turnaround was the third best in Division I history. In addition, Asheville finished in second place in the Big South Conference with a 9-5 mark; easily the best finish ever for the Bulldogs and the nine league wins also set a school record. Not bad for a club picked to finish in last place in Big South Preseason Polls.

Prior to coming to Asheville, Blöse did an outstanding job at Shepherd University, located in Shepherdstown, W.Va. where she inherited a program in the fall of 1995 that hadn't had a winning season in eight years. It took her just three seasons to post a winning record as the Rams compiled a 93-48 (.660) overall record in her final five seasons. She had a career record of 114-77 at Shepherd in seven seasons. The James Madison graduate led the Rams to the school's first-ever West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference title during the 1998-99 season. The Harrisonburg, Va. native was inducted into the Shepherd Hall of Fame this past fall.

Blöse began her college coaching career at her alma mater, James Madison University in 1987 where she served as an assistant coach with the Dukes program for eight seasons. She helped lead the school to three trips to the NCAA tournament and three Colonial Conference championships. Blöse was on the staff in 1988 and 1991 when James Madison advanced to the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA tournament. Blöse coached at Altavista (Va.) High School in 1984 and led the school to an amazing 69-5 record in three seasons. Blöse led Altavista to Seminole District Championships for three straight years and was the

District Coach of the Year twice. In 1987, she was named as a Virginia High School League All-Star coach.

A 1984 graduate of James Madison, Blöse was a four-year letterwinner in women's basketball from 1980 to 1984. She was the program's team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Blöse graduated magna cum laude in 1984 and was awarded the Johnston Senior Award for Excellence in Kinesiology.



## **Kenny Brooks** Head Women's Basketball Coach James Madison University

Thanks to Kenny Brooks, the JMU women's basketball program is back on the map.

As a JMU men's basketball player, Brooks (JMU '92) saw the Dukes' women's basketball team

play in the program's fourth NCAA Tournament "Sweet 16" in 1991. The team made national headlines by beating then nationally top-ranked Penn State on its home court in the tournament's second round.

Now, the seventh-year head coach has his alma mater headed back into national prominence.

He's guided the team to three straight postseason appearances, including the 2008 Women's National Invitational Tournament, the 2007 NCAA Tournament and the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament. The 2006-07 team was ranked in the Top 25 in both the Associated Press media poll and *USA Today* coaches poll. It marked the Dukes' first AP ranking since 1988 and first *USA Today* ranking since 1991. (Although not ranked, JMU was a vote-getter in both polls in 2001.)

Brooks was voted Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year and Virginia Coach of the Year in 2007, when his team set school records for regular-season wins (25) and victories on its opponents' home courts (12) and tied JMU marks for home wins (13) and home record (13-0).

The evidence of Brooks' impact:

- Top 25 national ranking
- An NCAA Tournament appearance in 2007.
- CAA championship game appearances in 2006 and 2007.
- 122 career victories in just six seasons.
- Reached 70 career wins in only 114 games, matching JMU Athletics Hall of Fame coach Shelia Moorman.
- A Women's National Invitation Tournament appearance in 2006 and 2008.
- Twelve all-conference selections. That's more all-conference players in his first six years than any other coach in JMU or CAA history achieved in his or her first six seasons.
- More than 75 school records.



## **Scott Moore** Assistant Wrestling Coach University of Virginia

Scott Moore is marking his fourth season as an assistant coach at Virginia. With a vast array of experience as a coach and two-time All-American wrestler, Moore has proven to be an invaluable asset to the Virginia program in the gym.

He also is a master recruiter, helping the Cavaliers bring in an exemplary first-year class in 2007-08. The class is a consensus Top-10 group, marking Moore's third-consecutive Top 25 recruiting class.

Moore, one of nine UVA All-Americans all-time, turned in one of the most prolific wrestling careers after just one season as a Cavalier.

In 2003-04, Moore etched his name into numerous categories in the UVA wrestling record books. Moore finished his dominant season with a record of 51-1 overall and 17-0 in dual matches with 34 of his wins (65 percent) coming by fall. He shattered both the UVA single-season and career record for most falls in just one year. Moore's 51 single-season wins ranks first all-time at UVA for a single season and his 17 dual match wins are the second-best mark at UVA. His .981 winning percentage is the second-best winning percentage for a single season at Virginia. This also marked the second season that Moore led the nation in pins and wins.

Moore finished third in the 2004 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, was ranked No. 1 in the country for most of the season and was the top seed at 141-pounds at the NCAA Championships. He was named ACC Wrestler of the Week four times during the season, and was awarded ACC Wrestler of Year for his efforts. Scott also won all seven regular season competitions in which he competed, including the Michigan State Open, Cornell Body Bar, Mat Town Invitational and prestigious Southern Scuffle. He also won his match at the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) All-Star Classic against returning National Champion Teyon Ware. Moore was also awarded the Gorrorian Award for the most falls in the least amount of time at the NCAA Tournament.

Moore began his wrestling career at Penn State (1999-2003) and went 125-42 over four years of competition (including one medical redshirt season). In 2002-03, he set the NCAA record for most matches competed in (63) and set a PSU school record for most wins a single season after going 54-9 with 24 falls during an All-America season for the Nittany Lions. In 2003 and 2004 he was awarded the Wade Schalles Award, given to the nation's top pinner.

### GENERAL CRITERIA

Nominees must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct, moral character, and carry the endorsement of their respective high school.

The categories of athlete, coach, and contributor are included on the nomination form for expediency in understanding the primary area in which an individual is to be considered for their achievements in interscholastic athletics and activities. The grouping is for screening purposes only and to assist those making the nominations in understanding the type of information required. Once nominees are inducted, they are not categorized, but all are recognized as members of the Virginia High School Hall of Fame.

To further explain, athletes would be former student participants who are being nominated for their achievements in interscholastic athletics. Coaches would be considered on the merits of their high school coaching achievements only. A contributor would be an individual who has made a contribution to interscholastic athletics or activities in some capacity other than those previously mentioned, including such areas as administration, sports, medicine, sports media, official, activities sponsor or participant, etc.

**All candidates will be judged on their significant and/or long term contribution to interscholastic athletics and activities. While many have served their school and local programs over a long and distinguished career, their accomplishments must have been worthy of state recognition for them to be considered. Longevity, without meaningful state impact, does not constitute appropriate credentials for hall of fame consideration.**

### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Coaches being considered must be retired or deceased with at least 20 years service in Virginia at a member school(s) or have served 25 years at a member school(s) and still actively coaching. Persons nominated as a contributor to the VHSL must meet similar criteria for a comparable period of time. If the candidate is a coach, the candidate must be a member of the Virginia State High School Coaches Association
- (b) Athletes are eligible for nomination 5 years after their high school graduation. Their nomination initially will be placed in a Inactive Category; 10 years after their high graduation, they will be placed in the Active Category and brought before the Screening Committee for consideration in the Hall of Fame.

### METHODS OF NOMINATION

- (a) Any VHSCA member in good standing or VHSL member school may nominate.
- (b) The nominating deadline is Oct. 31, in the year prior to the year of induction.
- (c) No individual may make more than one nomination per year.
- (d) Nominations for candidates not selected shall remain open for consideration each of the next two years but will no longer be considered thereafter unless a new renomination is submitted.

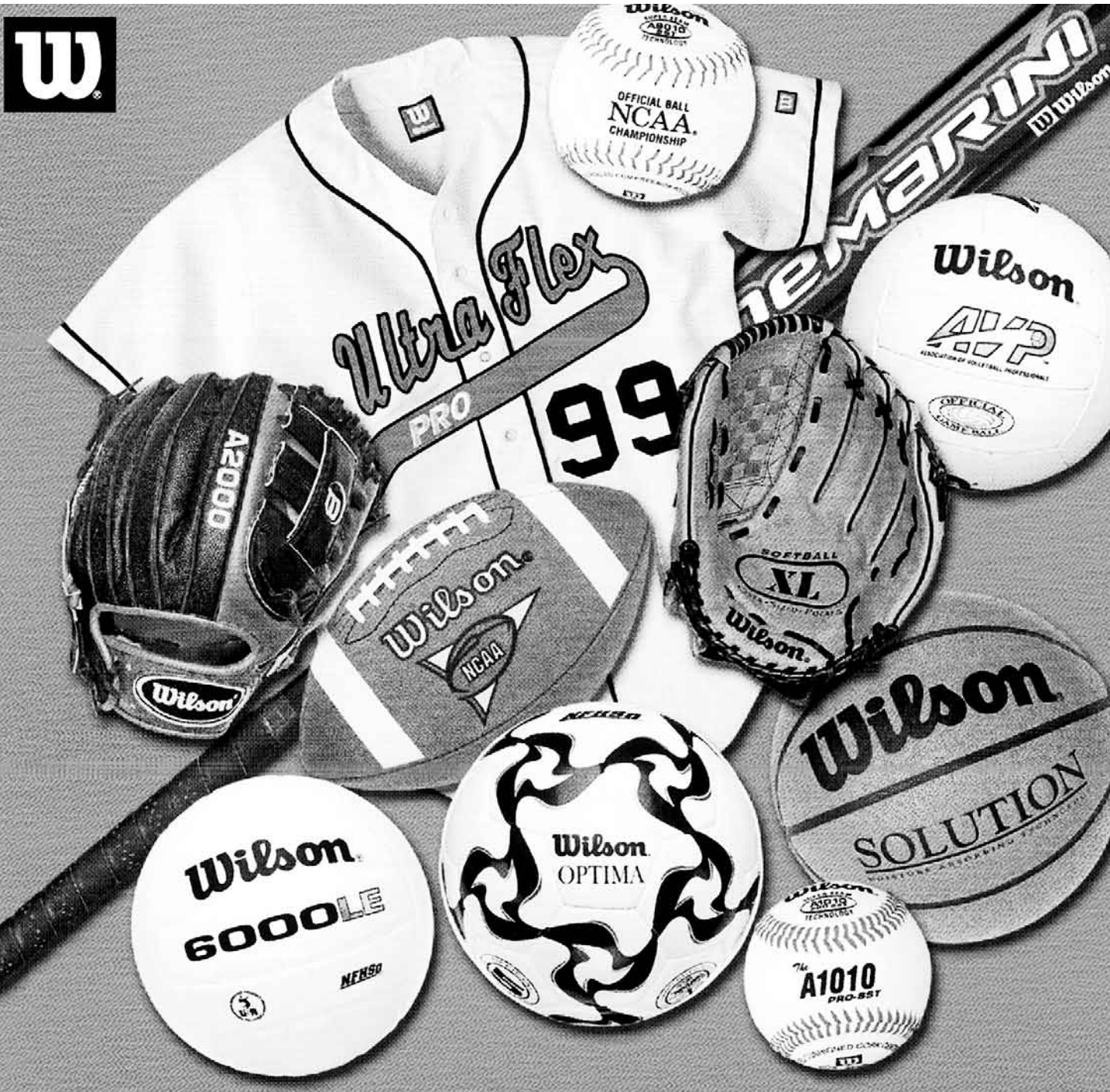

# VHSCA Awards

All awards presented by the VHSCA are listed below and included are any special criteria for special awards. For coaching awards, the coach must be an active member of the VHSCA. The awards application is always in the Virginia Coach. Send duplicate applications for each award requested.

**Note change in request procedure below!**

## I STATE CHAMPION RING AWARD

The VHSCA will present a ring to any active member head coach who has won two state championships in the same sport. Recipients need to submit the awards application form with ring size, stone, and verified two state championship years. There is no charge for the ring. Failure to attend and receive the ring at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$25.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1. A head coach can receive only one state championship ring. However, additional rings may be purchased.

## II STATE CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested. There is no charge. Failure to attend and receive the plaque at the VHSCA Banquet during the summer clinic will result in a \$10.00 charge unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

## III STATE RUNNER-UP AND REGIONAL CHAMPION PLAQUES

These plaques must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$12.00 per plaque. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

## IV DISTRICT CHAMPION CERTIFICATES

The certificates must be requested by submitting an awards application form. There is no charge except for postage and handling if requested within two years. Any requests prior to the previous two school years will cost \$3.00 per certificate. Send check payable to VHSCA with application form.

## V DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Four of these awards can be given each year (one per four areas of state). The only criteria is to submit a written nomination to the Awards Chairman.

## VI FRANK McCUE SPORTS MEDICINE AWARD

This award is presented each year to a doctor or trainer who has made outstanding contributions to high school athletics. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

## VII MARSHALL JOHNSON NEWS MEDIA AWARD

This award is presented each year to an outstanding high school sports journalist. A written nomination must be submitted to the Awards Chairman.

## VIII JIMMIE BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Three \$1,000.00 scholarships are awarded each year to outstanding high school senior student-athletes. Information, deadlines, and application forms will be in the October and February issues of Virginia Coach.

## X STATE COACHES OF THE YEAR (CAREER) AWARDS

During the July meeting of the VHSCA Legislative council, the Sports Interest Groups select fifteen coaches and one athletic director as State Coaches of the Year (Career) and Virginia's nominees for National Coach of the Year. The fifteen sports are football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, boy's track, girl's track, baseball, wrestling, swimming, volleyball, cross country, softball, soccer, golf, tennis, and special sports (gymnastics). The nominees enter competition for Regional and National Coach of the Year (Career) honors. These coaches are also honored at the Awards Banquet at our summer clinic with a State Coach of the Year (Career) Plaque.

## XI ALL-STAR COACHES AWARDS

At our summer clinic Awards Banquet, our football, boy's basketball, girl's basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball and boy's soccer All-Star coaches are presented a plaque.

## XII COACHES CAREER AWARD

Coaches are recognized after 10, 15, 20, 25, 30 (and so on) years service in the coaching profession. Combined head and assistant coaching experience is considered. To be considered for these awards, a coach must be an active or lifetime member of the VHSCA. Five years of service must be in a Virginia High School League member school.

- Step 1 The 10 year award is a certificate.
- Step 2 The 15 year award is a pin and certificate.
- Step 3 The 20 year award is a 7" x 9" plaque.
- Step 4 The 25 year award is a 8" x 10" plaque.
- Step 5 The 30 year award is a ring or plaque or engraved serving tray (recipients choice).
- Step 6 The 35 year is a 12" x 15" plaque.
- Step 7 The 40 year award is a desk or mantle walnut clock.

**\*NO RETROACTIVE AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN BEFORE STEP 5.**

**\*Awards for state champions, all ring recipients, steps four and above for milestone, and 25 year and up for career awards will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques and \$25.00 for rings and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.**

- 1) For sports such as baseball, basketball, football soccer, softball, tennis, volleyball, and field hockey; all wins in regular season, district playoffs, regional playoffs, and state playoffs may be counted.
- 2) For sports such as cross country, golf, gymnastics, indoor track, swimming, outdoor track, and wrestling; the procedure is different. Team victories in dual, tri, and quad meets can be counted. For regular season invitational meets or tournaments involving five or more teams, district championships, regional championships, and state championships; only the first place team will have one victory or win. A second place team finish or lower will not count as a win for this award.

\* All wins must be as a head coach of a specific varsity sport at a Virginia High School League Member School.

\* Criteria established so it is possible to reach a new level in approximately six years.

\* Boys and girls sports are considered separately. (example: If you coach boys and girls tennis, you are technically coaching **two** sports.)

\* To be considered for the "Victory Milestone Award," a coach must be an active member or lifetime member of the VHSCA and must send a written request for the award to the VHSCA Awards Chairman. Certification of wins by your principal is required.

\* Award will not be retroactive. (Example: If first request is after you have achieved Step 3, you will receive only the award for Step 3—Step 1 and Step 2 awards would not be given).

\* Awards beginning with Step 4 will be presented annually at the VHSCA Banquet held during the summer clinic. Failure to attend and receive the award will result in a charge (\$10.00 for plaques or \$25.00 for rings, pendants, and trays) unless the Awards Chairman is notified before July 1.

3) For sports such as golf that has a season running tournament the entire season counts the number of wins and losses by the way they finish at the end (accumulation).

# National High School Athletic Coaches Association Inducts **Two Virginia Coaches** into the Hall of Fame



**Danny Mitchell**

Danny Mitchell is from Hampton, Virginia. He and his wife Sindi have three children (Brooke, Danny, Jr. and Matt), a son-in-law who is like another son (Charlie) and a granddaughter (Madeleine). Danny was born and raised a Hampton High School Crabber. His ties to HHS run deep. He is a 3rd generation Crabber and his children all graduated from HHS (the youngest is a senior this year).

Danny's coaching career started in 1974, and in the ensuing 34 years, he has been an assistant football coach at Hampton High School. He was the wrestling coach for seven years, with 105 match wins and coached 4 state champions during that time. He has been the baseball coach since 1984 and the 1990 baseball team won a regional championship. He started and coached a youth baseball team (the Hampton Bombers) that has won four state championships in the last six years. Danny has been a part of 12 high school state football championships (either as a player or a coach) and reached the state finals another 4 times. The 1996 and 1997 teams were named national champions. He coached the Virginia High School Coaches Association All-Star Football game in 1998. He has coached over 150 all-district lineman and over 70 all-region and all-state lineman. He has been a long-time member of the Virginia High School Coaches Association and is the VHSCA All-Star Football Game Director and Assistant to the Director of the VHSCA All-Star Games. In 2002 he won the Assistant Football Coach of the Year award.



**Alvis Mann**

Alvis Mann is from Hampton, Virginia. He and his wife, Carol, have two daughters, Crystal Nicole and Jessica Renee. Alvis' coaching experience has spanned 32 years in Boys Tennis and 35 years as the Assistant Football Coach at Hampton High School, the number one high school program in the state of Virginia and America, led by Coach Michael Smith. The football team has won 12 State Championships, 3 State Runner Up Championships and 28 District Championships in the last 33 years. Alvis has coached in 2 Virginia All Star Football Games, in 1997 and again in 2001. In Boys Tennis he has been Coach of the Year in Peninsula District 5 times, also the National Coach of the Year in Region II and was a NHSACA Coach of the Year Finalist 2005 in Orlando Florida.

As a 35 year member of the Virginia High School Coaches Association, Alvis has served as President from 2002-2004. He has served on the legislative and executive committee. He is also the Assistant-Director to the All-Star Summer Games for the Virginia High School Coaches Association. Alvis has served his community as the Tennis Coordinator for the Achievable Dream Program in Newport News for 3 years, and also as the Tennis Director for Achievable Dream in Hampton.

# TIPS FOR COMPLETING MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

When completing the membership application, please keep the following tips in mind.

## BE SURE TO USE THE 2008-09 MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION.

1. Last name is first. Please put titles immediately after the last name, i.e. Jr., Sr., III, etc. (Include maiden name if newly married)
2. It is requested that the home address is used.
3. **PLEASE** complete the ZIP CODE boxes. It is not imperative to have the last four digits, but if known, please include.
4. All phone numbers need area codes.
5. Please provide birthdate – needed for insurance purposes.
6. Complete boxes for number of years as a coach.
7. Since active members must coach in VHSL member schools, the high school name must be printed in school boxes.
8. If a member last year, please provide membership card number.
9. Please list **ALL** coaching responsibilities.
10. **THE APPLICATION MUST BE SIGNED BY PERSON REQUESTING MEMBERSHIP.**
11. **THE LAST SECTION MUST BE COMPLETED AND SIGNED BY THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OR PRINCIPAL FOR ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP.**
  - Request for Life Membership **SHOULD** include the \$30.00 membership fee. Additional paperwork is required and will be sent upon receipt of initial application.
  - This is a one time approval and you need only to complete an application, and pay the membership fee in succeeding years.
  - Checks should be made payable to **VHSCA**.
  - Enrollment period is August 1 - November 1. No applications will be processed before August 1st. Requests for membership after November 1 will be processed **ONLY** if accompanied by certification that the coach was not hired prior to November 1 or is accompanied with an additional \$15.00 late penalty. **NO COACH WILL BE ALLOWED TO COACH IN AN ALL-STAR GAME IF NOT JOINED BEFORE NOVEMBER 1.**
  - **LOST OR DESTROYED** Membership cards will be replaced for a charge of \$10.00. Upon receipt of the fee, replacement cards will be mailed.
